

## E-Types steal the show

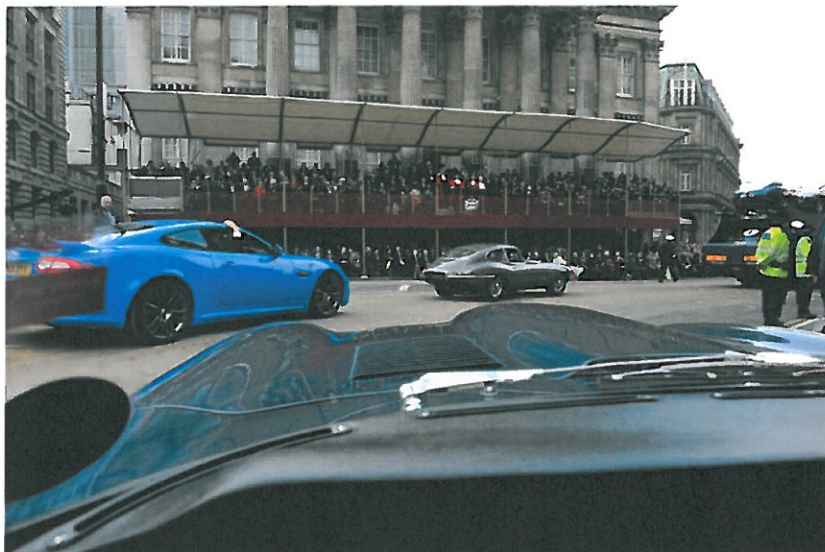
